

THE SDM SAFETY ASSESSMENT

Is there imminent danger to children?

NEEDS, RISK, AND SAFETY INDICATORS





Danger


Signals imminent danger of serious harm

Risk

Indicates likelihood of future CPS involvement

Needs

- May be related to danger or risk
- May need to be addressed on case plan



THE SDM SYSTEM AT EACH DECISION POINT

Should this referral be investigated?



Intake Assessment Can the child remain safely in the home?



Safety Assessment Should a case continue with ongoing services?



Risk Assessment What interventions could address child and family needs?



Case Planning
Tool

Can the child return home?



Reunification Assessment Should this case be closed?

SDM SAFETY ASSESSMENT: FOUR PARTS

- Factors influencing child vulnerability
- Safety indicators
- Safety interventions
- Safety decision

SAFETY INDICATORS

Ask questions that reveal . . .





Read to the period.



Examples are not all-inclusive lists.



Be aware of:

- AND
- OR



When unsure, ask others.



"Unasked" is different from "unknown."



Use professional judgment and common sense.

SAFETY INDICATOR #1 VS #4



SAFETY INDICATOR 2: CHILD SEXUAL ABUSE

Two conditions need to be met:

There has to be evidence of child sexual abuse. Evidence can and should include child report.

+

The child needs to continue to be in danger



SAFETY INDICATOR 14: CONSIDERING CURRENT CIRCUMSTANCES WITH PRIOR HISTORY

Two conditions need to be met:

A situation ALMOST rising to the level of one of the other safety indicators but is not quite there



Serious and confirmed prior maltreatment



VIGNETTE PRACTICE



PRACTICE #1: SAFETY INDICATORS

A report came in on 4-month-old child because they came to the pediatrician office for x-rays. The hospital found 5 rib fractures. The parents have no explanation except the child has been coughing hard the last couple days and must have fractured his ribs due to the coughing. The parents are the only caretakers of the child. The child does not attend daycare and hasn't been with anyone except the parents. The hospital is making a report that the injury is clearly non- accidental trauma.



PRACTICE #2: SAFETY INDICATORS

Mother was found to have been driving intoxicated in the car with her 3-year-old child. Mother lost control of the car and it rolled over into a ditch. The car was totaled in the accident. Fortunately, both the mother and child suffered no injuries in the accident.



PRACTICE #3: SAFETY INDICATORS

Upon a visit to the doctor's office, the pediatrician found evidence of sexual abuse of a 3-year-old girl that would have happened in the last few days. The girl visited with her maternal grandmother two weeks ago but has not been in the care of anyone except her mother and her boyfriend since then. Both deny any sexual abuse had occurred. They said they would take her to a different doctor and in the meantime will continue to care for her together.




PRACTICE #4: SAFETY INDICATORS

Worker observed bruising on a 7-year-old's arms and legs. Mother said she hit her child with a belt because he wasn't listening. Historical information on the case shows that the mother had previously been charged with a prior child death of her own child 12 years ago as a result of abuse and neglect.

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
Case Planning Tool Can the child return home?

Sample Period

Observation Period:

18 months later

We study future family and investigative assessments, substantiations and placements for families in the observation period and look for similar characteristics across the families.



RISK IS ABOUT LIKELIHOOD

Would you be glad to know whether the family you were working with had a . . .

- 1:2 chance of coming back?
- 1:6 chance?
- 1:12 chance?

Prediction







SOME ITEMS SEEM UNFAIR!


- Age of the youngest child in the home?

- Scored Risk Level
- Overrides
- Final Risk Level






